Following the Statement by the Chairperson of CTSAMVM, and the report from Deputy Chief of Staff on Important issues and events, CTSAMVM Technical Committee Meeting No. 18, Ceasefire status, PCTSA Implementation status, Violations and Investigations, CTSAMVM Challenges and operational issues, observations and recommendations for the Board, the CTSAMVM Board resolved as follows:

- 1. Welcomed** the new CTSAMVM Chairperson, Maj Gen Teshome Gemechu Aderie, and **appreciated** the contribution of his predecessor, Maj Gen Desta, and **wished** him the best in his future endeavours;
- 2. Adopted** the minutes and resolutions of the 13th CTSAMVM Board meeting, as amended, held in Juba, South

Sudan on 16 December 2019;

3. Urged the Parties to maintain the ceasefire and **urged** the Parties and the Security Mechanisms to take immediate and decisive action whenever the ceasefire is threatened;

4. Welcomed the Rome Declaration on the Peace Process in South Sudan of 12 January 2020 facilitated by the Community of Sant'Egidio in which the Leadership Council of the South Sudan Opposition Movement Alliance (SSOMA) consisting of both NAS (TC) and SSUM/F agreed with the Government of the Republic of South Sudan to commit /recommit and adhere to the Cessation of Hostilities Agreement of 2017;

5. Noted with serious concern the reports of: violence, including clashes between SSPDF and SPLM/A-IO aligned forces; movement of forces; hostile propaganda; and incidents of SGBV in the area of Maiwut/Jekau area, specifically along the Sobat River, and **urged** the Parties to allow CTSAMVM immediate, unconditional and secure access to investigate the most recent incidents of violence and other allegations of violations including recruitment *in a timely manner* in the areas of Maiwut and Jekau, amongst others; Also **welcomed** the initiative by JDB with the assistance of CTSAMVM to transport those involved to Juba in order to resolve the issues in that area;

6. Acknowledged the reported movement of forces from Cantonment to Training Sites and the deployment of trainers to the Training Sites however, **expressed** concern regarding the current state of registration of government organized forces, the lack of screening at Cantonment Sites, the lack of weapons storage and the imbalance of Opposition Forces to Government Forces reporting to the Training Sites and **urged** the JDB to immediately address these issues and to direct that the forces of all security services (Army, NSS, Police, Wildlife Service, Fire Brigade, Prison Service) immediately move to the designated cantonment sites or barracks and be registered, ready for screening, DDR, unification, training and redeployment;

7. Expressed concern over the lack of logistic support to Cantonment and Training sites, which has caused a significant pause in the implementation process, **regretted** that training of the Necessary Unified Forces has yet to start, and **urged** the NPTC to do all it can to deliver food and medical supplies to these sites in the near future to meet the requirements of the 100 day plan, and **recommended** that Board members also be included in Joint Field Visits (JFVs) conducted by CTSAMVM to Cantonment and Training sites;

8. Urged the NPTC to distribute already donated logistical resources to the Cantonment and Training processes, **urged** the parties and donors to provide resources to the Cantonment and Training process and **urged** RJMEC and IGAD to oversee that resources already donated are used in an effective and efficient manner;

9. Underscored that CTSAMVM undertake, as soon as possible, to provide gender disaggregated information, wherever such can be made available, of military personnel in registration, cantonment and training, so as to better take into account the female personnel;

10. Expressed concern regarding the violation reports presented: the attacks by NAS forces of Thomas Cirillo against SSPDF at Lor and Loka in August 2019; the fighting and failure to protect civilians and Denial of Access at Maiwut in August 2019; the Denial of Access by SPLM/A-IO in Panyume on 17 December 2019; the continued occupation of Civilian Buildings and rape by a soldier (SSPDF) in Juba, and **urged** IGAD to take appropriate measures to ensure NAS forces of Thomas Cirillo comply with the Agreement on the Cessation of Hostilities of December 2017, recently reaffirmed in the recent Rome Declaration and **urged** the Parties to address these violation reports and take immediate action to hold violators accountable and publish their accountability actions;

11. Appreciated the updated table from the CTSAMVM Technical Committee listing occupied civilian buildings, however, **expressed** concern regarding the violation report and lack of reduction in the number of occupied civilian buildings, **welcomed** the announcement at the meeting by the SPLM/A-IO of the vacation of the one remaining occupied facility, pending verification by CTSAMVM, and **called upon** the TGoNU to immediately vacate the remaining occupied civilian buildings;

12. Urged all the Parties to continue to educate forces on SGBV and to hold to account the perpetrators;

13. Reminded the Parties of their obligation under the R-ARCSS to allow CTSAMVM complete and unconditional freedom of access and **urged** the Parties to take remedial action when access is denied;

14. Urged the Parties, RJMEC and IGAD to follow up and act on reports and recommendations previously made to them from CTSAMVM and **urged** RJMEC and IGAD to take appropriate measures (including punitive) against measures against all violators of the Peace Agreement and the Cessation of Hostilities Agreement, in particular, perpetrators of SGBV and those continuously occupying civilian buildings;

15. Regretted the absence of the NPTC, JTSC and JMCC and again **requested** the NPTC, JTSC, and JMCC to attend and brief the Board regularly on the current and anticipated implementation progress within their mandate;

16. Expressed gratitude to the NPTC for covering the costs of the venue of the Board meeting, and **reminded** the Parties that members should come from Juba, as decided at the 11th Board Meeting on 10 October 2019 and communicated by the CTSAMVM Chair to party leadership on 14 October 2019;

17. Agreed that the next CTSAMVM Board meeting should be convened 21 Feb 2020, and the venue shall be

communicated by the Secretariat;

18. Decided to remain seized of all CTSAMVM matters.
